HOW IT WORKS

HUNGER 101 is a role-playing, interactive game that brings awareness to food insecurity and hunger in Tampa Bay.

Each participant is assigned a different scenario and then directed to purchase or obtain food and meet the 2000 calories per day goal.

Afterward, the group is gathered together to discuss the challenges faced while trying to achieve their task, given their assigned scenario.

Finally, we review the differences between food insecurity and hunger as well as ways to help address this issue in our community.
